FOREWORD

95 percent of Fortune 500 CEOs, according to Fortune magazine, played competitive sports at some level. While only 6 percent of Fortune 500 CEOs are women, the proportion of women CEOs who were athletes is similar—90 percent of them played sports at some point, and 54 percent played sports at the university level. The advantages of participating and competing in collegiate sports are both immediate and lifelong. Participating in college sports provides opportunities to learn, compete and succeed.

A significant benefit of playing competitive sports is to increase one's probability to be admitted to a top academic university. In addition, student athletes have access to top-notch academic support, quality medical care and regular access to outstanding coaching, facilities and equipment. Finally, student-athletes as a group graduate at higher rates than their peers in the general student body and feel better prepared for life after college. Further, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (which will be explained in greater detail later in the report) provides significant opportunities for women to become student athletes.

The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) is an organization dedicated to providing a pathway for college athletes. More than 1,100 colleges and universities including all Ivy League schools are members of the NCAA. Those schools work together with the NCAA national office and athletics conferences across the country to support 500,000 college athletes that make up 19,500 teams competing in NCAA sports.

Individual schools award athletics scholarships. Divisions I and II schools provide more than US\$3.6 billion in athletics scholarships annually to more than 180,000 student-athletes. College athletics are responsible for generating billions of dollars of revenue for universities. Division III schools, with more than 190,000 student-athletes, do not offer athletic scholarships/financial aid. However, Division III schools do factor athletic participation on school teams in the admission process, and student athletes are viewed favourably. Many student-athletes across Divisions I, II & III receive some form of athletic scholarship, academic grant, and/or need-based financial aid.

The NCAA's diverse members include schools ranging in size from those with hundreds of students to those with tens of thousands. The NCAA's current three-division structure was adopted in 1973 to create a fair playing field for teams from similar schools and provide college athletes more opportunities to participate in national championships.

ASIAN OPPORTUNITY

Although Asians represent 7% of the U.S. population and make up only 2% of NCAA students-athletes in 2021, Asian representation in the NCAA has grown dramatically and has increased by over 40% over the last decade. Furthermore, amongst the top-15 U.S. academic universities (as defined in this report), Asian student-athletes represent 11.8% of the student-athlete population, with over 1,400 Asian student-athletes across the 15 schools, led by the California Institute of Technology (Caltech) at 39.4% and Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) at 26.8%. These trends show not only increasing opportunities for Asian student-athletes overall, but also opportunities are most prominent at leading academic universities.

In addition, while the overall Asian representation in the NCAA is at 2%, Asians make up a much greater percentage of student athletes in select sports, such as 14.6% for men's fencing and 10.5% for women's Division I golf. The sports with the greatest amount of Asian participation are golf, fencing, gymnastics, tennis, swimming, and volleyball. Indeed, amongst the top-15 universities studied in this report, four sports have over 40% Asian representation, Men's & Women's Fencing, Women's Golf, Co-ed Rifle and Women's Tennis; three sports have over 30% Asian representation, Men's Golf, Men's & Women's Squash and Men's Tennis, and two sports have over 20% Asian representation, Men's & Women's Swimming & Diving and Men's Volleyball.

This will be the first report in an on-going series to showcase the status of Asian representation in collegiate sports at leading US universities. Future reports will highlight additional top academic schools and provide deep dives in select sports, while highlighting success stories and athletes

ADMISSIONS

Potential student-athletes around the world wonder how their involvement in sports will impact their college admissions and whether participation in sports will give them any advantage. Regardless whether the student-athlete has been recruited, aspirations of continuing to play at the varsity level or intends to enjoy community/intramural sports, college admissions committees look at sports participation in college applications favorably.

Universities admission is increasingly competitive as more students achieve similar academic results. As record low university acceptance rates are set year after year, admissions committees increasingly seek students who demonstrate the ability to achieve high academic results while balancing extracurricular activities. Strong academic performance is no longer sufficient to gain acceptance to leading universities. Participation in sports, especially competing and representing one's high school at the varsity level, can be the extracurricular push an applicant needs to stand out. This can be most relatable towards Asians, who on average, score 20% higher on standardized tests than global averages – forcing Asian applicants to find new ways to differentiate themselves.

The Academic Index is a numerical value derived from all scores a candidate submits as part of his/her college application. The Academic Index Score includes, but is not necessarily limited to, standardized testing scores (SAT/ACT), Subject Test scores and class rank. Although universities do not publish their Academic Index, and every school derives their own formula, it is commonly accepted that good athletics paired with good academics can push an applicant through in a tiebreaker.

This report will first explore three ways students can become college athletes, via recruitment, preferred walk-ons, or regular walk ons, and also discuss the different college athletic divisions, and how divisions impact how athletics is factored into admissions.

Regardless of the level of sport participation, sports are viewed favorably as an extracurricular activity to university admission committees

RECRUITED ATHLETES

A recruited athlete is an athlete who is asked to join a university sports team on an athletic scholarship. The athlete works with that team's coach to ensure that the student meets the appropriate academic benchmarks to gain acceptance to the university. Even recruited athletes face stiff competition, as athletes oftentimes find themselves one of many in a field of high-level high school student athletes. When there are two athletes with roughly equivalent abilities, the athlete with better grades, test scores, and overall candidacy will receive the admissions offer.

PREFERRED WALK-ONS

Universities have a limited number of athletic scholarships and frequently face difficult decisions regarding whom to award scholarship grants to. When coaches do not have adequate scholarship grants to offer a place to an athlete they view as desirable, that athlete is sometimes given a priority in the application process, and hence remains eligible to earn a scholarship in the ensuing years. As with recruited athletes, preferred walk-ons with stronger applicant profiles are more likely to be accepted to their intended university. Preferred walk-ons may still join the school's team but won't necessarily receive a scholarship for doing so.

WALK-ONS

Walk-on athletes apply to universities regularly, with no coach or athletic department involvement. When the student begins his/her freshman year, he/she attends an open tryout where they are athletically evaluated. The coach then decides whether to extend the student an offer to play for the team. For athletes who want to continue with their sport above all else, joining a club or intramural team is another viable option. Most schools offer ways to participate in sports outside of official teams.

NCAA divisions are based on school size, athletic budget, and the number of scholarships available. These divisions allow for fair competition among different-sized schools with variable expendable resources. Scholarships vary widely by sport. For example, a DI school can offer a maximum of 85 scholarships for football, and a maximum of 4.5 scholarships for golf. These numbers typically reflect the school's degree of involvement in a given sport as well as the amount of revenue that sport generates for the school.

Ability to compete at a varsity level in any NCAA Division will strengthen a students' candidacy for admission

DIVISION I

Universities in the NCAA Division I have the largest student populations and the most scholarships available. Over 165,000 students are Division I student athletes. All major collegiate sports conferences (SEC, Big 10, Pacific-12, and ACC) are Division I. Ivy League schools are also Division I, but do not offer athletic scholarships due to a binding agreement amongst the Ivy League Conference.

There are NCAA eligibility requirements for the academic achievement of student athletes, but are generally far below the average grades and test scores of most admitted students. How high an applicants' grades and tests scores need to be depend on the policies of individual schools.

What schools require in terms of grades also vary by sport; for example, the top basketball and football players in the nation will receive more leeway than the top rower or fencer. Finally, while coaches do have the ability to influence admission, influence varies by both school and program.

DIVISION II

Universities in the NCAA Division II are smaller universities, both public and private, usually with fewer than 10,000 students. All athletic scholarships offered are equivalency scholarships, meaning that the total amount of available scholarship dollars is divided among athletes more evenly (more details of equivalency scholarships below). Most athletes receive a partial scholarship, rather than a few select athletes receiving a full scholarship. Approximately 110,000 students around the country are DII student athletes. Division II schools often offer less academic leeway than DI schools, but coaches can still be very influential in the admissions process.

DIVISION III

With 195,000 students, 446 universities, and 44 conferences, Division III is the largest division of collegiate athletics. At Division III institutions, student athletes comprise roughly 25% of the student body on average. While Division III athletes are not eligible for athletic scholarships, 75% of Division III athletes receive non-athletic scholarships or need-based financial aid. Division III athletes also have a 5% higher graduation rate than other student athletes. Division III coaches have the least influence when it comes to admissions decisions. While they still can advocate for their preferred candidates, how much this impacts admissions officers varies widely between schools.

Whether an athlete is recruited or not, the application itself remains the same. Once a student's application is submitted, the athlete will notify the coach, and the athletic department will tell admissions to flag the application to make sure the student is considered for a position on the team as well as an athletic scholarship. It should be noted that being an athlete is less influential in admissions decisions at many upper-tier schools than at other institutions.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Receiving an athletic scholarship to compete at the college level is the ultimate goal for many student-athletes. Athletic scholarships are typically one-year agreements between the college and the athlete, although some are multi-year. Fewer than 2 percent of high school student-athletes are offered athletic scholarships, however, scholarships value add up to over \$3.6 billion annually, creating opportunities for aspiring student-athletes. However, it's important to understand that most athletic scholarships are partial and do not cover the full cost of tuition.

Head count sports are defined as revenue sports: for men, this includes Division I basketball and football; for women, this includes Division I basketball, tennis, volleyball and gymnastics. Head count sports always offer full-scholarships.

Equivalency sports generally provide partial scholarships, and discretion is given to coaches to divide their scholarship money among athletes. Coaches can choose to offer a full scholarship to one extremely high-level recruit (although that is rare), or they can choose to spread the money out among multiple athletes, which is much more common.

Equivalency sports for Division I men include baseball, rifle, skiing, cross-country, track and field, soccer, fencing, swimming, golf, tennis, gymnastics, volleyball, ice hockey, water polo, lacrosse and wrestling. For Division I women, equivalency sports include bowling, lacrosse, rowing, cross-country, track and field, skiing, fencing, soccer, field hockey, softball, golf, swimming, ice hockey and water polo. All Division II sports are equivalency sports.

Ivy League schools, although Division I, do not give out athletic scholarships—only providing need-based financial aid. Coaches can help their prospective athletes obtain financial aid rewards, but they do not have scholarship grants to award student athletes.

Because most college student-athletes do not have full-ride scholarships, it's beneficial to look into earning an academic scholarship as a supplemental form of aid. There are minimum academic standards student-athletes must meet to be considered for an academic scholarship, and these are different for every college and university. Remember, Division III schools only offer non-athletic scholarships, like academic scholarships.

In addition to athletic scholarships, a variety of merit-based academic scholarships and financial-aid resources are available to assist students

It should be noted that academic scholarships are much more secure than athletic scholarships. Losing an athletic scholarship is the unfortunate reality for some college student-athletes. There are a few different situations in which this might occur, including injury or poor athletic performance, poor academics, behavioural issues, or coaches can simply decide not to renew scholarships for subsequent years. Students on academic scholarships will remain on scholarship so long as grades are maintained, even if they no longer compete in the NCAA

TITLE IX

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 is a Federal statute that was created to prohibit sex discrimination in education programs that receive Federal financial assistance, including higher education. The text of Title IX stated, "No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." There are three basic parts of the Title IX as it applies to athletics:

Participation: Title IX requires that women and men be provided equitable opportunities to participate in sports. Title IX does not require institutions to offer identical sports but an equal opportunity to play.

Scholarships: Title IX requires that female and male student athletes receive athletic scholarship dollars proportional to their participation.

Other Benefits: Title IX requires the equal treatment of female and male student athletes in the provisions of (a) equipment and supplies, (b) scheduling of games and practice times, (c) travel and daily allowance/per diem, (d) access to tutoring, (e) coaching, (f) locker rooms and practice and competitive facilities, (g) medical and training facilities and services, (h) housing and dining facilities and services, (i) publicity and promotions, (j) support services, and (k) recruitment of student athletes.

Title IX has helped transform women's athletics. The year Title IX passed, 2% of college athletic budgets went to women's sports. Around 15% of college women participated in sports. And colleges, on average, offered 2.5 women's teams.

Those numbers increased dramatically in the following decades. While fewer than 30,000 college women participated in sports in 1981, over 200,000 did in 2017. By 2004, colleges offered an average of more than eight different women's sports teams. During 2006-2016, the number of female athletes at the college level grew 25%. In 2021, women make up 44% of all NCAA student athletes.

The impact of Title IX spread beyond college sports. The number of high school girls participating in sports grew 990% from 1971 to 2003. Similarly, the number of female Olympians skyrocketed. In 2016 at Rio, women outnumbered men 292 to 263 on the U.S. Olympic team, compared with 90 women to 338 men in the 1972 Olympics.

However, despite these advances, there is still a gender discrimination that limits sporting opportunities for women at the intercollegiate level. Despite Title IX's success in opening doors to women and girls, the playing field is far from level for them. For example, although women in division I colleges are 53 percent of the student body, they receive only 41 percent of the opportunities to play sports, 36 percent of overall athletic operating budgets, and 32 percent of the dollars spent to recruit new athletes.

As Title IX requires that female and male student athletes receive athletic scholarship dollars proportional to their participation, it is often difficult for universities to compensate for the amount of players in female athletics, as university American football teams (only offered for male athletics) have up to 125 and on average 105 active players, while there is no similar sport for women. Oftentimes, a school's American football program has as many male participants as the top four women's sports combined.

Title IX gives women athletes the right to equal scholarship, funding and resource opportunities as men

Asian women in particular at leading academic universities have been significant beneficiaries of Title IX

METHODOLOGY

Although our methodology is new, we have iterated and refined our approach through discussions with schools and higher education experts, trends in historical data and researching new data. Our detailed methodology is transparent in part for use by schools, academics, and students in the hopes they will find our data useful.

Our data is manually collected by an experienced team. Our team individually examines each schools' athletic teams, accessing public data released by the universities to research individual athlete's background and heritage. An individual is classified as an Asian if one of the athletes' grandparents is of full Asian descent, or if the athlete identifies as Asian. Admission rates and average SAT and ACT scores reported are from the matriculating class of 2020.

Asian countries as classified as the following: Afghanistan, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Brunei, Cambodia, China, Georgia, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Israel, Japan, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Kyrgyzstan, Laos, Lebanon, Malaysia, Maldives, Mongolia, Myanmar (Burma), Nepal, North Korea, Oman, Pakistan, Philippines, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Syria, Tajikistan, Thailand, Timor-Leste (East Timor), Turkey, Turkmenistan, United Arab Emirates, Uzbekistan, Vietnam, and Yemen.
